2.	<p><b>Principal's Report</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>École Arbour Vista Public School Council            Principal's Report - September, 2017</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. This year's enrolment at Arbour Vista is 493 students. This represents an increase of ten students from our enrolment in June, 2017.</li> <li>2. As a result of Arbour Vista's reorganization during the first week of school, a total of nine students changed classes. During this process we managed to remove the Grade 4/5. This annual event is due to the fact that all schools within the Upper Grand District School Board must collectively comply with the Ministry of Education's class size parameters.</li> <li>3. On Wednesday, September 20<sup>th</sup> EQAO released its Grade 3 and Grade 6 assessment results from the May, 2017 assessment. The results are indicated below. 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	<p>6. Arbour Vista’s Intermediate football teams and soccer teams have started to prepare, during their recess time, for their city wide tournaments, taking place in the coming weeks.</p> <p>7. Arbour Vista has established an Equity and Inclusion Committee. During our school wide assembly students were encouraged to explore their creative side and motivated to make their mark this year. Teachers will follow-up with students to see where their creative sides take them during the course of the year!</p> <p>11. Arbour Vista will be participating in Journee des Franco-Ontariens on Monday, September 25<sup>th</sup>. Students are asked to wear green and white that day. This day is the anniversary of the Franco-Ontarian flag. This is the 407<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Franco-Ontario presence within the province and the 42<sup>nd</sup> anniversary of their flag.</p>
