School Council

The purpose of the School Council is, "through the active participation of parents, to improve pupil achievement and to enhance the accountability of the education system to parents."

School councils meet approximately once a month and are responsible for:

- Sharing information and seeking input on matters the School Council is discussing.
- Providing advice to the principal and school board on issues such as school year calendars, strategies to
 improve school performance, codes of conduct and dress, curriculum priorities, safe arrival programs,
 community use of schools and community programs provided at the school, selection criteria for
 principals and board policies that will affect the school.
- Many school councils are also actively involved in organizing social events for the school community and fundraising events

Council meetings are open to everyone in the community, so you do not have to be a member to attend. It is a great way to keep up with what is happening in the school. You can also contact the School Council if you have questions about how to get involved at the school or if you are looking for information from a parent perspective.
