- As a school, we also set goals and some of ours are of course improving academic achievement and helping our students learn to read, write and be proficient in mathematics. - **Early Pick-Up**

If you are picking up your child early, ***you do not need to call in advance.*** Please just come in early enough and we will call the child down once you arrive. We respectfully ask that parents do their utmost NOT to pick up students early unless it cannot be avoided. This creates a lot of disruption in the classroom.

- **Contact Information**

If your home or email address or phone numbers have changed, please be reminded to update the school as well

- **NEW Volunteer Policy**

There have been changes made to the Volunteer Policy. It was passed by trustees recently and is effective immediately. This will mean that any volunteer that comes into contact with a student will need a Vulnerable Sector Check.

Attached you will find the required information that needs to be completed prior to volunteering at École Arbour Vista Public School. Two of the attached forms need to be returned to the school (School Volunteer Application and Volunteer Agreement) as well as a Criminal Record Check.

You will need to obtain a Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening. You can apply for a Criminal Record Check including a Vulnerable Sector Screening online through the Guelph Police Service site

<https://www.guelphpolice.ca/en/request-for-information/vulnerable-sector-check.aspx>. If a personalized letter is required by the Police Services, please contact the school.

Once you have all three required documents please bring them into the school office or send them in with your child to school. We will then add this information to our central volunteer binder. You are only required to complete the forms once for the year and criminal record checks are good for 5 years. In years when you do not complete a criminal record check, you will be asked to sign an offense declaration form in lieu of having a new Criminal Record Check completed.

We are incredibly grateful for our many volunteers. We appreciate the extra work that this may take, however the safety of our students is our utmost priority.

- **SCHOOL CROSSING GUARDS: CITY OF GUELPH ONLY**

The City is experiencing a shortage of crossing guards and are currently struggling to cover all locations. They are doing their best to fill these gaps; however, the program may have unforeseen vacancies due to guards calling in for same-day coverage.

The priority is to cover the no-control intersections first. Control locations include intersections with traffic signals, intersection pedestrian signals (IPS) and all-way stops. We will cover these locations if we can.
