These Big 5+ Ideas include, Phonological Awareness, Phonics, Vocabulary, Reading Fluency, Reading Comprehension and Written Expression. These Big 5+ ideas are important components of literacy instruction in the classroom as well as support at home. This document provides suggested ideas that require little to no preparation to help support foundational literacy skills at home.

Please feel free to engage in these activities in French, English or the primary language that is spoken at home. There are many skills and abilities that transfer between different languages.

These skills can include phonological awareness skills, phonetic skills, comprehension strategies, higher-order thinking skills and familiarity with text formats, such as books, manuals, recipes and websites. For multilingual learners, it is important to foster and support these early literacy skills in a child's first language.
