#### Forest of Reading : Blue Spruce and Prix Peuplier

Between the months of January and the end of April, Brisbane students participated in the Forest of Reading, an annual province-wide reading initiative that highlights Canadian authors, illustrators, and publishers while encouraging young people to develop a love of reading. Many primary classes read the Blue Spruce and Prix Peuplier books as a class and junior students were invited to join the Silverbirch Reading Club. The club met weekly at recess and students were able to choose new and exciting books to read, earn prizes and vote on their favourite book. On April 26th Brisbane held its official Forest of Reading Voting Day. Classes were invited to the library to vote on their favourite books. Brisbane's favourite Prix Peuplier book was *Droles de zebras* and the top Blue Spruce book was *Are you a Cheeseburger*?The Silverbirch club voted *The Undercover Book List* as their number one book. With the arrival of spring and an increasing need for band aids, our Kindergarten class found that there was a problem with the band aids at BPS. Our class noticed that our band aids were only one colour and only represented lighter skin tones. We've been learning a lot this year about how important it is that everyone is welcomed and represented in both our classroom and our school, so we started to brainstorm together. The students decided that we should have "les pansements pour tout le monde" (band aids for everyone) so that anyone who needed a band aid at school would be able to choose one that would match their skin colour.

We coloured some band aids and made a bulletin board, then we invited Mme Oussoren to listen to our idea and the students asked if our school could purchase band aids that were representative of different skin colours. When she said yes, we did some research and found two Black-owned businesses, Tru-Color Bandages and Heal in Colour (located in Toronto) that sell band aids for multiple skin tones. When they arrived, our class was so excited that we wanted to hand some out to every class in the school. These band aids are now available in the office!

We are excited to continue celebrating the diversity here at Brisbane and if you need a band aid while your're at Brisbane, we hope you'll take a look at the options and choose which one works best for you!


