Applying for Scholarships

When filling out scholarship applications, keep the following in mind:

If asked to include a list of involvements:

- Include all relevant accomplishments and experiences...in school and out of school
- Emphasize leadership, initiative, and commitment use key words (eg. led, facilitated, initiated, organized, ran etc.) be sure to state long term involvement and following things through start to finish where applicable
- Put official name of event/organization whenever possible and describe it briefly if needed (many people will not know what it is)

Tips for essays/questions:

- Do not just list involvements. That is already part of your application and every applicant will have an impressive list. You need to stand out through your essay/answers.
- Be true to you...100% (what you're passionate about, why you've been involved in certain activities, etc.)...it will show!
- When answering different questions on the applications try to use different examples for each question in order to really show the diversity of your skills, characteristics, and experiences
- Give specific examples in your answers. It is better to talk about one or two examples in-depth, rather than briefly discussing many examples
- Talk about the following: *really spend some time reflecting before you start to write*
 - Why did you do these things?
 - What did you gain through these experiences?
 - What did you learn?
 - o Challenges that arose and how you overcame the challenges?
 - How have you grown?
 - How have you impacted others?
 - What does leadership mean to you? Why are you an effective leader?
 - What are your plans/goals/aspirations for the future?
 - What will you bring to their school/community?
 - o How will you make a difference? And how have your experiences to date helped to prepare you?
