### **Animation & Design Foundations:**

Course Code: Life Drawing for Animation (AFA4T)/Design Foundation (AEL4T)

# of credits: 2

Semester: 1

Passing grade: 50%

Campus: Humber College - Orangeville - **WEDNESDAYS**

### **Life Drawing for Animation 1:**

This is a drawing fundamentals course that introduces students how to properly interpret and record visual information. It begins with the study of the five basic components; perceptual skills, the perception of edges, spaces, relationships, lights and shadows, and the whole design.

### **2D Design Foundation:**

This is an introductory course in the fundamental concepts and elements used in two-dimensional design. The course deals with the tangible elements of design relating to composition and the intangible elements relating to the creative process. All projects embrace the sequential process of developing successful designs, including thumbnails and ideation, semi-comprehensive studies and final image.

### **Early Childhood Education:**

Course Code: Child Development: Prenatal-2.5 Years (TOF4T)/ Health & Safety (PPO4T)

# of credits: 2

Semester: 1

Passing grade: 50%

### **Child Development: Prenatal to 2.5 Years:**

Explores and examines child development from the prenatal period to two and a half years and prepares the early childhood professional to promote the growth and development of children by establishing an individually responsive and inclusive program. Emphasis is on the study of child development theory, including principles, domains and stages, as well as an appreciation of the potential impact of heredity, family and culture.

### **Promoting Health and Safety:**

Early childhood educators provide optimal health, safety and well being for all children within early learning and care settings. To understand the roles and responsibilities of the individual, team and community, current health and safety information, the types and levels of child abuse and knowing how to respond to various situations in a professional manner will be examined. Emphasis will be placed on municipal, provincial, and national legislation and regulations regarding human rights, child protection, health and safety, as they relate to diverse early learning and care environments.

### **Police Foundations:**

Course Code: Intro to the Canadian Criminal Justice System (HCF4T)/Criminology (HCC4T)

# of credits: 2

Semester: 2

Passing grade: 50%

### **Intro to the Canadian Criminal Justice System:**

This introductory course provides you with an overview of the Canadian criminal justice system with a particular emphasis on the history, function, role and organization of Canadian law enforcement services. The operation of the criminal justice system will be examined and analyzed in light of contemporary issues affecting the system. Each of the major components from enforcement through the courts and correctional service will be explored.

### **Criminology:**

This course provides an examination of various theoretical explanations of criminal and deviant behaviour including the sociological, biological and psychological perspectives. Criminological theory is related to various types of criminal activity and the reality of crime in Canada.

### **Cosmetology:**

Course Code: Cosmetics Application (TXI4T) / Intro to Spa Management (TXG4T)

# of credits: 2

Semester: 2

Passing grade: 50%

### **Cosmetics Application:**

Students will gain an overview of the cosmetic and fragrance industry, current issues, and the various industry stakeholders. Featured in the discussion are current concerns such as green products and packaging, the regulatory environment, consumer groups and employment opportunities.

### **Intro to Spa Management and Client Service:**

This course will introduce students to the spa industry and give them knowledge of the historical significance of spas, as well as what the future holds in this rapid growing industry. Topics include spa architecture and design, brand recognition and marketing tools to represent your spa to clients, purchasing products, equipment and communication systems designed specifically for spas. There is also a focus on good business practices such as client management, ethics and employee relations.
