

The Upper Grand District School Board is committed to disrupting systemic racism and oppression in all of its forms. We will implement ongoing mandatory anti-racism and anti-oppression training for all staff, review our protocols and policies, including our hiring practices, and be fully transparent and accountable to all Upper Grand students, staff, families, and stakeholders in an ongoing manner.

#### **Field Trips**

On April 25th, Grade 5 and 6 students attended the River Run Centre for the presentation of Mistati. Thank you to Linamar who provides Grade 1-8 students in the City of Guelph the opportunity to enjoy live performing arts programming each year at the River Run Centre. Our Grade 1-6 students have participated in one or two performances this school year. On May 4th, students in M. Devenny and Mme Mui's class participated in Empowerment Day at the Sleeman Centre. Thank you to Mr. Speers, a teacher at Elora Public School, who organizes Empowerment Day with a dedicated group of UGDSB staff and students. Students in Grades 1 to 4/5 watched Le chat botté at The Bookshelf Cinema on May 5th. This event was subsidized by French cultural funding through the UGDSB. Thank you Mme Woodward for organizing this event. The Grade 6 class joined other Guelph Grade 6-8 students for an Emergency Preparedness Day workshop at the West End Recreation Centre on May 12th.

#### **Presentations**

Thank you Constable Sherry Pettapiece for joining our Grade 3-5 students on May 9th for a bicycle safety presentation. Constable Sherry presents various safety topics to our students throughout the year. She also supports training and organizing special events for the CAA Safety Patrol program.

Thank you also to Mr. Gord Herbert from the Fire Prevention Division with the Guelph Fire Department. Mr. Herbert shared a fire prevention and safety presentation with Kindergarten and Grade 1 students on May 15th.

#### **Teams and Clubs**

Pokemon Club continues to be very popular on Friday afternoons. Mme Smyth and a group of dedicated Grade 5 students are running a basketball skills and drills workshop for Junior students. M. Devenny and the Junior ultimate frisbee team participated in a tournament at Exhibition Park on May 10th. #### JK Welcome Visit for students and Families




