

**CHRISTINA E. HILL M.D., F.R.C.S.**

**1945 -2004**

Voted "most intelligent GCVI graduating student" in 1963, Christina Hill also maintained an active extra-curricular schedule. She participated in the Drama Club, Acta Nostra, Student Council, the school store and volleyball and basketball. Throughout, she maintained high academic standing as the top student in grades 10 and 12 (F.A. Hamilton Scholarship) and was on the grade 13 honour roll.

When she graduated, she was awarded the Medical Alumni Scholarship from the University of Toronto, the Carter Scholarship for the Government of Ontario, an Ontario Government Scholarship, the Victoria-Guelph Chapter I.O.D.E. Scholarship, and the James Davison Scholarship. After she graduated from the University of Toronto in medicine (1969), Dr. Hill became the first female specialist in urology. She was former president of the Federation of Medical Women in Canada and the Ottawa Academy of Medicine (1989).
