Dear GCVI GRADE 9 Student and Parent/Guardian;

Mr. McCabe, Ms Chesney (Vice Principals) and I would like to extend a warm welcome to you! In September you will be Secondary School students and we are so excited that you are joining us at GCVI. You will receive another letter addressed to all families in the school in mid to late August with additional opening week details, but we wanted to provide you with some information now in this letter to help you start planning for your high school experience.

As a school we are very proud of our over 160 years of history, while still maintaining diverse and innovative programming. Our mission is to develop informed, engaged and responsible global citizens. These aspects of citizenship are achieved through social responsibility, academic rigor, environmental stewardship, intercultural understanding and the pursuit of positive relationships, health and well-being. We are committed to ensuring students feel safe and see themselves represented in their classrooms. At GCVI we are proud of our past and confident in our future.

Grade 9 Orientation

We would like to invite all grade 9 students to GCVI for the Grade 9 orientation on **Wednesday August 31st, from 8:45AM to 12:45PM.** Students should bring a water bottle for the day and snacks will be provided. Each Grade 9 student will have two LINK leaders who they will meet during orientation. LINK Leaders are senior students who will be their mentors for their first year of high school. The purpose of the orientation and mentorship program is to help ease the transition for Grade 9 students into high school, meet new people and encourage Grade 9s to get involved at GCVI. During orientation students will take part in a number of activities as well as receive their timetable and go on a school tour. Between August 29th-30th all Grade 9's can expect a call from one of their LINK leaders who will share more information about the day and answer any questions. It is highly recommended that all Grade 9 students attend orientation on August 31st; however, if anyone is unable to attend, they will still be assigned LINK leaders who will support their transition to high school.

- Photo Day will be held on Thursday, September 15th. Please have your photo taken for your free Student Photo ID Card and you may purchase additional pictures at a cost (picture packages will be sent home with students on the first day of school). A Photo "retake" day is scheduled for October 20th, 2022.
- The Grade 9 Open House for parents/guardians & students will take place on Tuesday, September 20th at 6:00 p.m. Parents/guardians will have an opportunity to meet the students' teachers and ask questions regarding the course curriculum and evaluations. A letter and invitation to this evening will be sent home with students during the first week and messaged to all grade 9 parents/guardians through our messenger system.
- **Busing:** To access busing information, please visit the transportation website at https://stwdsts.ca/ In the last 2 weeks of August, parents can obtain September busing information by creating a new account through the Parent Portal. If parents already have a Parent Portal subscription from previous years, they will be able to access busing information through their existing subscription.
- **Timetables:** Grade 9's will receive a paper copy of their timetable during the Grade 9 orientation on August 31st. Timetables for the first semester will also be available from their teacher in their first period class (We have all students and first period classes posted at the school for the first day to help students locate their homeroom/period 1 class). Also, as of **Monday, August 29th,** students can view their timetables through *Edsembli connect*.
 - Website: https://connect.edsembli.com/
 - Username: First 5 letters of the student's last name and the first 3 letters of their "Usual" first name. No spaces or hyphens or special characters
 - Example: John Smith = smithjoh
 - Password: The student's 9-digit OEN. This number can be found on a report card to the right of their name or on their student card.

- Guidance & Timetable Changes: Any students looking to connect with a guidance counselor, Child and Youth Counselor or Social Worker, can do so through making an appointment through this link: https://forms.gle/MHpR7U8virbsrzc37
 - If you need to make a change to your timetable during the first week, times will be available after school to make changes. After the first week, or if you cannot stay after school to make changes, be sure to fill out the google form and someone from guidance will contact you to come to Guidance for an appointment
- Fees: All students will have the opportunity to demonstrate course expectations and achieve course credits with no financial cost. This year, GCVI will not be asking for any registration fees. That said, some courses may provide enhancement opportunities for students to extend their learning and enrich their experience. These enhancements will incur a cost which the students may be given the option to pay. Course handouts given out on the first day in all classes will provide information regarding enhancement opportunities and an outline of associated costs. It should be noted that financial assistance may be provided to support a student due to financial need. Please contact the school administration in order to access support. Where fees may be applicable, parents/guardians/students are encouraged to use SchoolCashOnline. You can find instructions for setting up <u>SchoolCashOnline here</u>.
- Attendance & Personal Technology: We expect each student at GCVI to take responsibility for their learning and behavior. We believe that regular attendance and punctuality are required for academic success, and that both are also desirable work habits. Please inform the school in advance of an absence, if possible, and provide a note explaining the absence the day the student returns to school. Acceptable reasons for missing classes are: school related activities (trips, teams), illness, bereavement, unavoidable causes (medical appointments, emergencies), and religious holidays. Personal technology is allowed for use within our classrooms for the purpose of enhancing student learning. Technology (Cell phones and computers) are allowed for educational use in supervised areas *at the discretion of the classroom teacher*.
- What to Bring to School: Students may bring a lock and use a locker that is close to their homeroom for their personal belongings. All students will need to provide their lock combination to their homeroom teacher. If students choose not to use a locker, they should keep personal items in a backpack with them throughout the day including their lunch. Secondary Students are to bring:
 - Knapsack or tote bag for personal belongings
 - Face Masks (optional at this time)
 - Personal water bottle
 - Seasonal outdoor wear
 - Only those items that are necessary for the day (e.g. laptop, textbook, notebook, pens/pencils, calculator, etc.)
 - Personal Technology
 - o Lunch
 - Lock (Locks are also available to purchase at the front office for \$5.00)
