Event Updates:

Mental Health Presentation

We had 10 parents attend and many were able to ask very specific questions and get feedback from the

small photobooth station for families to utilize. The event was very easy to run and ran smoothly

 Successful event. All the Grades participated. We rented black lights from Long and McQuade. The kids loved following along to the Just Dance songs.

Follow Up From Previous Meetings

Science Night

Science Morning. Will take place on Saturday, April 25th at the school. It is booked. Will take place from 10 – 12 PM. Gym is already booked. They will require some time before and after for clean-up. Some volunteers will be required to oversee the two stations that will not have a Scientist. Otherwise, they will take care of everything. There will be six stations in total – four will have a scientist with them, the other two are self-directed.

Jersey's and Tent

- Being done by Print T's. We have paid a 50% deposit and the jerseys should be in within the next week.
- We have asked for a quote on getting a logo put on to the tents that we currently have and are waiting to hear back from Print T's
- The school will be doing another school-wide shirt order in the near future so families have another opportunity to order school clothing

Pollinator Garden

- Met with the individuals who run the Pollinator Garden and talked with them about the educational component of the program. They have some PDFs that will be shared with families and assemblies that will be done to help educate the students on bees and what benefits they bring for our community
- They will also work with classes to help further their education on this topic

Annual Plan Review

- Review of the events that have taken place so far (Family Skate, Dance-A-Thon, Movie Nights, etc.,)
- We will be unable to do the Family Night with Summit Climbing due to insurance issues with the board so this will be put off for this year
- Have some upcoming Parent Information Nights however our turn out in the previous nights has not been great. Question of whether there are different activities that might be better to do that will bring more families out. Idea to do a Family Paint Night/Art Night, a Family Just Dance Night or a Family Zumba OR Yoga Night.
- Council will look into different artist options to setting up a family art night
- Idea to do an event on a Sunday afternoon when more families are around and available
- End of the Year Event idea to do a Family Play Day outside with local food trucks on June 12th (5:30 7:30)

Principal Leadership Input

- Every year the board asks for input on Principal Leadership for us to give input in the event that our Principal
 is moved
- This provides us with an opportunity to share our vision, needs and initiatives as a school with the board
- Will review this again at the next meeting

Other Business

- In the last meeting, it was decided that we are pausing the mental health initiative funds for this year. The
 teachers were told and have also been given the new by-laws and the request for funding forms if they
 would like to request anything from council
- Pizza Day was brought up there have been some complaints amongst parents that the quality of the pizza has gone down. Council will make note of that and contact Pizza Pizza about the concerns
- Question around the playground at the back of the school, it is requiring maintenance. They tried to repair it
 last year, however there have been some roadblocks around getting it fixed (i.e., you can't get the same
 type of slide, etc.). Need to look into more options around what to do next. discussion around replacing
 the whole climber and that potentially this should be our next major fundraising initiative
- Discussion around how to allocate the remaining funds in the budget- decision was made to wait and see if any teachers or staff make requests in the next month
