Create your own topper label</li> <li>2. Place M&amp;Ms in bag</li> <li>3. Staple topper over bag opening</li> </ol>
	<p>Reindeer Candy Canes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Candy canes</li> <li>● Goodly eyes</li> <li>● Red pom poms</li> <li>● Pipe cleaners</li> <li>● Glue</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Place dots of glue where you want eyes and nose and place googly eyes and pom pom on top</li> <li>2. Twist the pipe cleaner around the top of the candy cane once or twice to secure it. Then, bend them in an antler shape</li> </ol>
	<p>Reindeer Hot Chocolate</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Bags</li> <li>● Hot chocolate powder</li> <li>● Chocolate chips</li> <li>● Marshmallows</li> <li>● Glue</li> <li>● Googly eyes</li> <li>● Pomp om</li> <li>● Pipe cleaner</li> <li>● Label</li> <li>● Ribbon or string</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Create your own label</li> <li>2. Place hot chocolate in the bottom of the bag</li> <li>3. Add chocolate chips</li> <li>4. Add marshmallows</li> <li>5. Twist the pipe cleaner around the top of the bag to close and bend it in an antler shape</li> <li>6. Place dots of glue where you want eyes and nose and place googly eyes and pom pom on top</li> <li>7. Secure the label with string or ribbon</li> </ol>
	<p>Crayon Hearts/Shapes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Crayons</li> <li>● oven safe baking mold</li> </ul> <p>Silicone works well</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Use an oven-safe baking mold and fill them up with the crayon pieces</li> <li>2. Bake at 300 degrees for 15 minutes or until they are completely liquid</li> <li>3. Allow to cool in mold for 2 hours</li> <li>4. Carefully remove from the mold</li> </ol>

	<p>Santa Letters</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Wooden letter</li> <li>● Paintbrush</li> <li>● Hot glue gun</li> <li>● Paint (red, white, black, gold)</li> <li>● Mini hat ornament (options)</li> <li>● Ribbon</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Paint letters and hat, adding details such as the black belt and gold buckle</li> <li>2. Secure option mini hat with hot glue</li> <li>3. Cut 2" of ribbon and secure with hot glue on the back of the letter</li> </ol>
	<p>Clothespin Snowman</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● wood clothespins</li> <li>● yarn in various colours</li> <li>● glue</li> <li>● orange mini pom poms</li> <li>● white paint</li> <li>● paint brush</li> <li>● black marker</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Paint clothespin white</li> <li>2. Using yarn, tie a scarf on the clothespin</li> <li>3. Draw two eyes, a mouth, and black buttons on the snowman's body using a black marker.</li> <li>4. Add a drop of glue between the eyes and mouth and stick on an orange mini pom pom.</li> </ol>
	<p>Snowman Tealights</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Battery operated tea lights</li> <li>● 1 Black and 1 Orange Sharpie</li> <li>● Red Ribbon (like this and this)</li> <li>● Red Pipe Cleaners</li> <li>● Red Pom Poms</li> <li>● Glue Gun</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Using a black Sharpie, draw a simple face onto the tea light</li> <li>2. Cut a 2.5" piece of red pipe cleaner and curve it around the tea light. Use glue on both ends to hold it</li> <li>3. Add hot glue where the ears are and add the pom poms</li> <li>4. Cut out a 4.5" piece of ribbon. Cross it over itself and add a small dab of hot glue to hold it together</li> </ol>

		<p>5. Add a small line of glue to the back of the "scarf" and then glue it to the back of the tea light like in this picture</p> <p>6. Cut a piece of the thinner red ribbon to be approximately 11" long and then slide it under the pipe cleaner. Then, tie a tiny knot in the ribbon to keep it together.</p> <p>7. Colour the nose orange using a marker</p>
	<p><b>Craft Stick Trees</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● 3 popsicle sticks (one with about 1" cut from the end of it)</li> <li>● 1" x 1" square of brown card stock</li> <li>● A star from card stock</li> <li>● 6" piece of twine</li> <li>● Hot glue gun</li> <li>● Scissors and a craft/utility knife</li> <li>● Tiny pom poms, pipe cleaners, bells, rhinestones, buttons, glitter</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Cut a star out of card stock</li> <li>2. Trim off about 3/4" to 1" of the popsicle stick by cutting it with a craft (or utility) knife</li> <li>3. Glue the sticks together like a triangle</li> <li>4. Decorate!</li> </ol>
	<p><b>Ribbon Trees</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Thread</li> <li>● Needle</li> <li>● Ribbon</li> <li>● Beads</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Cut a 6" piece of ribbon</li> <li>2. Thread the needle</li> <li>3. Thread through one end of the ribbon and fold it over</li> <li>4. Thread a bead and thread back through the ribbon</li> <li>5. Repeat steps 3 &amp; 4 until you have reached the end of the ribbon and top with a bead</li> <li>6. Loop leftover thread to create a hanging loop</li> </ol>

	<p><b>Bookmarks</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Decorative Ribbon at least 1/2 in. wide</li> <li>● Elastic Hair Bands</li> <li>● Decorative Buttons</li> <li>● Scissors</li> <li>● Needle &amp; Thread or Sewing machine</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Cut the ribbon into 18-inch strips</li> <li>2. Fold one end of the ribbon over 1/4 inch, fold it over another 1/4 inch and stitch across (by hand or sewing machine)</li> <li>3. Repeat for the other end of the ribbon, adding the elastic hair band before you start folding to attach it to the ribbon</li> <li>4. Use your needle and thread to attach a button to the other end of the ribbon</li> </ol>
	<p><b>Peppermint Sugar Scrub</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. 2 cup Sugar</li> <li>2. ¼ cup Coconut Oil</li> <li>3. Red Food Coloring</li> <li>4. Peppermint Essentials Oil</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Pour sugar into a medium-sized bowl</li> <li>2. Mix coconut oil &amp; a few drops of Peppermint Essentials Oil</li> <li>3. Divide your sugar mixture into two equal-sized portions</li> <li>4. Mix in a few drops of red food colouring to one portion</li> <li>5. Add your sugars to the jar in layers. Press your sugar down with a spoon, or I use a can to compact</li> <li>6. Alternate between your pink and white</li> </ol>
	<p><b>Craft Stick Bookmark or Ornament</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Craft sticks</li> <li>● Paint (various colours)</li> <li>● Paint brushes</li> <li>● Felt (various colours), optional</li> <li>● Ribbon (optional)</li> <li>● Hot glue gun</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Paint the popsicle stick according to your design</li> <li>2. After the paint has dried, add details such as eyes, nose, buttons</li> <li>3. Add details such as hat, scarf, etc. and secure with hot glue</li> <li>4. If you are making a bookmark, you are done!</li> <li>5. If making an ornament, cut 2" of ribbon and glue it onto the back of the stick in a loop shape</li> </ol>
	<p><b>Pipe Cleaner Ornament</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Pipe cleaners</li> <li>● Beads</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Knot 1 end of a pipe cleaner</li> <li>2. String beads onto pipe cleaner according to the desired pattern</li> <li>3. Bend pipe cleaner as required based on the desired shape</li> <li>4. Once complete, twist the loose end around to knot closed</li> </ol>

	<p>Clothes Pin Wreath</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Clothes pins</li> <li>● Metal clothes hanger</li> <li>● Green paint</li> <li>● Red beads</li> <li>● Ribbon</li> <li>● Scissors</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Paint clothes pin green</li> <li>2. Cut the rounded hanger off and discard; shape the hanger into a circle</li> <li>3. Thread a red bead</li> <li>4. Beside the bead, clip a clothespin so the clip faces the outside of the wreath - repeat around the circumference of the wreath</li> <li>5. Knot the ends together when complete</li> <li>6. Loop the ribbon around to create a hanger</li> <li>7. Take a second piece of ribbon and create a bow, tying it to the hanging ribbon</li> </ol>
	<p>Glass Gem Magnets</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● decorative glass gems</li> <li>● 3/4" round ceramic magnets</li> <li>● magazines, photos or pretty paper</li> <li>● Mod Podge</li> <li>● paintbrush</li> <li>● hot glue gun</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Cut the paper to match the size of your gem</li> <li>2. Apply a thin coat of Mod Podge to the flat side of the gem and press it firmly onto the cut paper. Let dry for 20min</li> <li>3. Cut off any excess paper if required</li> <li>4. Using a hot glue gun, apply a dot of glue to the magnet and adhere it to the back of the papered gem</li> </ol>
	<p>String Art</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Wooden blocks</li> <li>● Nails</li> <li>● Hammer</li> <li>● String of various colours</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Hammer nails into the wooden block in the design you wish to create</li> <li>2. Loop the string through the nails to create the look you wish to achieve</li> </ol>



### Canvas Art

- Printed artwork (holiday theme, word clouds, family, etc)
- Canvas of any size
- Paintbrush
- Modpodge
- Old gift card

1. Google the artwork you are looking for and print the number of copies you need
2. Cut the artwork to match the size of your canvas
3. Brush the canvas quickly with a light layer of Modpodge
4. Stick the artwork on the canvas and brush another light layer of Modpodge on top
5. Using the old gift card, lightly scrape down the artwork to remove bubbles and seal the edges. Let dry for 1 hour.



### Bath Bombs

- ½ cup baking soda
- ¼ cups corn starch
- ¼ cup Epsom salt
- 14 cup citric acid
- 3-4 tsp coconut oil
- 1-2 tsp water
- 1 tsp essential oil
- Bath bomb mold
- Bowl
- Wisk
- Optional adds: confetti, food colouring, small trinket, etc

1. Combine all dry ingredients in a bowl and gradually add wet ingredients, stirring with a whisk until thoroughly mixed
2. When the mix is wet enough to stick together in clumps, press the mixture into molds until filled. Remove excess from sides
3. Let the mix sit in the molds for 5 minutes and remove the bath bombs from the mold; let dry 24hrs






### Crayon Candles

- Old crayons
- Glass votives of any shape or size
- Wax
- Wicks
- Dixie cups (or any paper cup)
- Popsicle sticks (for stirring)
- Microwave
- X-acto knife

1. Peel the paper off your crayons. You can use an X-acto knife or soak the crayons in water for easy peeling. Place a wick into the container.
2. Fill a dixie cup with wax and microwave for 1 minute. Stir and microwave again in 30-second intervals until the wax is completely melted. Pour a thin layer of wax into the bottom of each votive and place



		<p>the candlewick in the center. Let harden.</p> <p>3. Using one crayon per colour, fill a dixie cup with wax and top with a broken-up crayon—microwave for 2 minutes and then in 30-second intervals until completely liquefied. Let cool for 30 seconds, and pour coloured wax into the votive. Let the first layer dry for 20-30 minutes.</p>
	<p><b>Felt Superhero Masks</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• felt (red, blue, white, yellow, green, black, gray, and ivory)</li> <li>• thread</li> <li>• 3/4 inch elastic</li> <li>• free superhero mask patterns</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Create superhero mask templates on spare paper. Cut two of the overall shapes in the base colour. Next, cut out any details (letter, hair, etc.) and sew them to just the top layer.</li> <li>2. Cut your elastic to be about 14". Pin the two layers together, sandwiching (and pinning) about an inch or so of the elastic in the middle on each side.</li> <li>3. Sew around the whole outer edge of the mask and eyes with thread that matches the fabric. Trim it up, and you are done.</li> </ol>
	<p><b>Duct Tape Pencil Roll</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Duct Tape sheet (8.25" x 10")</li> <li>• Coordinating fabric (at least 9" x 11")</li> <li>• Additional coordinating Duck tape rolls</li> <li>• Rotary cutter, mat and straight-edged ruler</li> <li>• Scissors</li> <li>• Large needle and coordinating embroidery thread</li> </ul>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Adhere Duct tape sheet onto the fabric side you DON'T want facing out. Using the sheet as a guide, trim off the excess</li> <li>2. To create pencil roll pockets, fold up one side about 3 1/2" inches. Before securing the sides with more Duct tape, secure the hair band in the middle with a piece of Duct tape.</li> <li>3. For the edge with the hair band, cut a little slit first and then tape it down. Finish off with a smaller piece of Duct tape to size over the cut edge.</li> </ol>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Large button</li> <li>• Hairband</li> </ul>	<p>4. To create the single pencil pockets, measure every 2" along the top of the pocket sleeve and mark it off with a Sharpie dot, making 5 sections/4 dots. Use a large needle and embroidery thread to stitch a straight stitch from the top of the pocket down to the bottom.</p> <p>5. Each pocket will use 18" of thread, folding it in half after threading it through the needle (knotted the end.) Start at the top of each Sharpie dot and stitch through both layers of the pocket, leaving the knot in the center of the pocket. At the end of the pencil pocket, tie another knot and cut off the thread, leaving about an inch of thread to create a fringe.</p> <p>6. Attach a large, coordinating button with your thread and needle on the back side of your pencil roll, on the stitched line closest to your hair band hook.</p>

### Tassel Clip Bookmark

- Large Paperclips
- Embroidery Floss
- Scissors

1. First, open your paper clip and thread it through the loop in your embroidery floss, then close the paper clip.
2. Cut off the floss to about 1 ½" and cut a single string about
3. 4" long.
4. Place the single string under the tassel and tie in a knot near the paperclip.
5. Wrap the remaining string around the bundle and knot.
