

Definition of Bullying

Bullying is typically a form of **repeated, persistent, and aggressive behaviour**, directed at an individual or individuals, that is intended to cause fear and distress and/or harm to another person's body, feelings, self-esteem, or reputation.

Bullying occurs in a context where there is **a real or perceived power imbalance**.

Bullying takes on different forms and contexts with age. It can be physical, verbal, social/emotional or through the use of technology.

Bystanders contribute to bullying by doing nothing to prevent it or by becoming actively involved in supporting it.

SCHOOL VISION

Standards of Behaviour

Students will:

- respect others
- use appropriate language
- dress appropriately
- show proper care for the property of others
- arrive prepared, on time, and ready to learn

Serious breaches of the PCPS Code of Conduct include:

- possession of illegal substances
- possession of dangerous weapons, or objects.

Range of Consequences:

- verbal reminder
- verbal reprimand
- detention
- withdrawal of various school activities and/or privileges
- making up missed instructional time
- removal from class setting
- parents/guardians contacted
- in school suspension
- out of school suspension
- involvement of police
- expulsion

The range of consequences listed above includes a progressive approach to discipline. They are designed to match the student's needs to the appropriate intervention. The consequences may or may not be followed in any particular order.

STUDENT, STAFF, AND PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

- ✓ Respect others
- ✓ Accept responsibility for personal actions
- ✓ Fulfill academic obligations
- ✓ Engage in behaviours that support safety (physical, social, and emotional)
- ✓ Demonstrate a responsible attitude toward use of computers and the internet

CODE OF POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR

Parkinson Centennial Public School's Code of Positive Student Behaviour is based upon the Ontario Code of Conduct and the Upper Grand District School Board's Code of Conduct (policy #213) which apply to students, staff, parents/guardians, and volunteers – whether they are on school property, on the buses, at school related events or when engaging in an activity that may have a negative impact on the school's climate.
