Welcome November!

We have a busy month ahead with Remembrance Day, Treaties Recognition Week, progress reports, Parent-Teacher interviews, and Bullying Prevention week to name just a few of the items of significance for this month!

I want to acknowledge and thank staff who are taking the time to organize and run extra curricular activities before and after school, as well as at recess. COVID restrictions made it impossible to run such activities in recent years. With the lifting of restrictions, these activities are happening again. Thank you for the time and talents of the teachers who are running them! This month students will have the opportunity to participate in: grade 4-8 choir, Eco club, junior and intermediate volleyball, intramurals, Pride club, JEDI (Justice Equity Diversity Inclusion) club, book club, kindergarten helping, and corking club. While many students are energetically embracing the return of extra curriculars, others are apprehensive or nervous about becoming involved. We know that involvement in school activities helps to foster connections among students and builds a sense of belonging to the school community. Please discuss with your children what is happening at school and how they are choosing to become involved. Your child's Google Classroom will have all the extra curricular events posted, so you can encourage your child to participate.

A reminder that students' regular attendance at school, arriving punctually and ready to learn (healthy), greatly impacts student success. Accumulated absences and/or lates impact a

student's ability to keep up with the curriculum content. Just a reminder that if your child will not be attending school or will be late on any given day, please call us at 519-925-3939 and leave a message on the attendance line, ext. 100. Please include your child's name, bus number, teacher's name, and indicate illness or absence. It is the parent's responsibility to notify the school if their child(ren) will be absent or late. We also request that you send a note (including the bus number and teacher's name) or call the school before 2:30 p.m. if you are picking your child(ren) up during the day or at the end of the day.

Progress report cards will be going home this month to recognize student progress this term. Please review student successes and areas of need with your child. Continue to encourage daily reading and good study habits.

It is getting chilly out and the snow will be here soon! Please remember to send indoor shoes, assist your child in wearing the proper clothing to school and label it. This includes a warm jacket, hat, mitts, and waterproof footwear. Thanks for sending extra socks in your child's backpack just in case, and extra clothes for our Kindergarten students! All students are expected to participate in outdoor recess and we will continue to make use of the outdoor classroom space. Our playground structures will be closed for use as of November 1st.

Our Community Gardens

Our vegetable gardens have been tucked into bed for winter, with a layer of fall leaves covered by straw. Some of our grade three classes have taken the opportunity to learn from the garden over the past month. They have collected and compared soils, carefully dug out invasive weeds, clipped off plants to leave roots intact to improve soil health, delighted over the many living creatures found when working in the soil, and planted garlic to settle in over the winter. The Learning Commons will host a "Discovery Station" in the second and third week of November featuring seed heads from the pollinator garden. All students will be welcome to visit and explore seeds using our 20x - 40x magnifiers. Grade three students noticed some pretty amazing things when zooming in on the seeds they discovered and wanted to share with the school community.

Life in the Learning Commons

Our first book club this school year read “Song for a Whale”, written by Lynne Kelly. You may see this title again as a Disney+ movie, and we all agreed it will make a good one. Inspired by Iris, the main character, we have spent days taking apart old appliances to see what is inside. Another book will be announced on our morning announcements soon for students to participate if they wish.

The [Forest of Reading](#) books have been announced! We look forward to this program each year. Primary students will all be involved in the “Blue Spruce” picture book program in the Learning Commons from January - April. Students in grades 3 & 4 qualify for “Silver Birch Express”, grades 5 & 6 qualify for “Silver Birch”, grades 7 & 8 qualify for “Red Maple” and students in grades 5-8 qualify for “Yellow Cedar” (all non-fiction). There is a good deal of independent reading that needs to happen to complete the program... so if you wish to participate, you can start **anytime** you can get your hands on the books! Brittany Hooker, the children’s librarian at the Shelburne Public Library, is an amazing resource and will have these books in their collection. We hope to have our titles soon. 😊

We will host a **SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR** November 21 - November 29 in the Learning Commons. We will be OPEN during the EVENING of THURSDAY NOVEMBER 24 and ALL DAY FRIDAY NOVEMBER 25. Our last book fair was an amazing success. The proceeds allowed us to buy consumable items for the maker space as well as books and five sets of “Code and Go” mice, which have been very popular!

Eco Update

We are back in full swing with our Eco initiatives at Primrose and are working hard to achieve Platinum status again, just like we did last year. On October 19th, our students participated in Take Me Outside Day and were engaged in lots of fantastic outdoor learning opportunities. Additionally, each class now has a GOOS (Good On One Side) Bin that they are using to help reduce our school-wide paper waste. In November, all classes will be having a presentation by Dufferin Waste to learn more about sorting our garbage and recycled goods as we work towards eliminating waste in our school. Our goal is to get as many students as possible bringing a litterless lunch to school. We use our virtual announcements to share ideas on how to do this - ask your child about it! Additionally, we have many classes taking on their own Eco initiatives, which we will share more about as the year progresses. Thank you to everyone in our Primrose community who works hard every day to help our school maintain its eco-friendly status and the best place to be! Good job Pumas!

The week of November 21-25 is Bullying Prevention Week. As a school, we will help students to understand the difference between conflict and bullying, and help them to realize that while conflict is normal, bullying is not.
