#### **Special Education Resource Teachers and IEPs**

This year our Special Education Resource Teachers (SERTs) will be supporting students in their classroom and/or in the resource room. The SERT, or your child's classroom teacher, will chat with you to let you know if your child would benefit from this opportunity to receive additional support.

This year, Mrs. Pasmore will be the SERT for the primary division, Ms. Rigby/Ms. Carle will be the SERT for the junior division and Mrs. Robertson will be the SERT for the intermediate division.

Parent(s)/Guardian(s) of students with an existing Individual Education Plan (IEP) will have received an email on September 19, 2023, containing a feedback form to help inform the revision of their child's IEP. Currently, the special education team is working on updating IEPs and a revised copy will be sent home on October 17, 2023. The special education team asks that you review your child's IEP and sign and return the consultation form that will be attached to the IEP.

#### **Safety Week**

This coming week Oct 10 - 13 will be "Safety Week" in our school. Each year we are required to have six fire drills (3 in the Fall), two lockdown drills, a tornado drill and a bomb threat drill. We will also be sounding the alarm bell so students know what it sounds like and to test our various pull stations in the school. We will be reassuring students that there are no concerns and that it is a drill. You may want to let your children know, particularly if your child gets anxious with drills.

#### **Terry Fox Run 2023**

Students from K-8 participated and joined in the Marathon of Hope by participating in a run to raise money for cancer. We raised \$710.00 in both cash and online donations. Thank you to all who donated and to Madame Di Felice for all her hard work organizing and making this a fun and worthy event.

This year we are introducing a subcommittee to the Parent Council to achieve even more for the school. Parents are able to be on the fundraising committee and are not required to attend School Council meetings to be on this committee. #### Pizza Days

We are excited to have Pizza Days again! Thank you School Council for arranging this for us!.

The funds raised are going towards supporting a variety of initiatives that support students including the Forest of Reading Program, Family Transition Place seminars, class trips and bussing, Scientists in School programming, Kindergarten and Grade 8 Graduation costs and playground toys.

Our pizza is provided by New Orleans and costs \$2.50 or \$3.00 per slice and is paid through cash online (no cash is accepted). Pizza will be ordered monthly this year. Our first order is due **Monday**, **October 9th** to cover October and November pizza days. You will be able to order 2 weeks before the next month. It will be delivered to classrooms at first nutrition break. If your child is absent on Pizza Day, kindly consider your payment a donation to School Council for this year's fundraising goals. No refunds will be issued. Please note there will be NO same day sales of individual slices. In the event of a "snow day" falling on a Pizza Day, Pizza Day will be moved to the following Friday. Should this not be possible due to another snow day, cancelled classes etc. an alternate will be advised separately.

# **Food & Friends School Nutrition Program**

Our student nutrition program provides free healthy food available to all students with bins in every classroom. Each morning, cooler bags containing a dairy option (typically yogurt or cheese), a fruit or vegetable option and a grain option (usually a bagel, muffin or biscuit) are delivered to each classroom and available to any student. These bags remain available in each classroom in the morning and then again at the second nutrition break for students. Students are encouraged to bring their own snacks that they can enjoy during these times as well. Please remember to send a water bottle with your child as we are an Eco School and will not be handing out cups. If your child needs a water bottle and/or would benefit from their own individual snack bag please do not hesitate to reach out to our Vice Principal, Mrs. Hopkins, for more information.

#### **Equity and Inclusion**

The UGDSB is committed to ensuring policies and procedures that promotes a safe and inclusive school climate for all students and staff. As educators we have a greater responsibility to ensure equity, diversity, and inclusion in our classrooms and school. There are lots of resources available at the board's site to support our considerations of planning events, celebrations, assessment, and curriculum contents in connection with dates of importance for diverse students and families. The month of October is full of some important days of celebration, commemoration, and observance for students, staff, and families which includes Hispanic/Latin America heritage, Islamic heritage, Learning disability awareness, etc.

#### Kiss and Ride

A reminder to all parents that are picking up students at the end of the day that there is NO PARKING in our Kiss and Ride loop. If you need to pick up a primary (K-4) child from the gym you must park in a designated parking space. Our Kiss and Ride is well used by parents of our older students and having parents in this area poses a safety risk to our older students and causes congestion. Please respect the signage and the routine of the school and use parking spots if you need to park. Thanks for your attention in this matter.

#### STUDENT PICK UP AT THE END OF THE DAY

We ask that if you are picking up your child at the end of the day that you call in by 2:30 pm. Since we are a fully bused school the office is very busy at the end of the day and your call may not be answered and returned right away. Thank you for understanding.

#### October 31, 2023

October 31st is celebrated as Halloween by some members of our school community while others do not recognize this day. On Tuesday October 31st students at Primrose that celebrate Halloween are welcome to wear costumes (no masks, weapons or blood/gore) to school in the morning or orange and black clothing. We would ask those students choosing to wear a costume, wear it over top of their clothes and arrive at school already dressed up. Students will be asked to change out of their costumes after our first learning block. We will have a Primary parade in the morning starting at 9:30 AM. Children are welcome to bring in pre-packaged treats for their classmates, however if you do not want your child to have any of these treats please speak to their teacher prior to Tuesday.

Halloween is a day that is not observed by all students or staff. It is considered a choice to participate as are all spirit days. Alternative and supportive accommodations and activities will be provided for students if they choose not to participate. As a school community, it is our responsibility to have a space that is welcome to all. Students must avoid wearing identities and cultures as costumes. This includes appropriative costumes/cultural stereotypes, body-shaming and objectifying costumes, and costumes that joke about situations that have caused harm. Such costumes perpetuate stereotypes and can cause harm that can further marginalize and oppress community members. We will be continuing with programming as usual at the school on the 31st and your child will be expected to participate in outdoor learning and therefore will need to dress for the weather conditions.
