## **Land Acknowledgement:**

On Remembrance Day, I take time to reflect on how lucky we are to live where we live. I honour all the people who made sacrifices to protect our rights and freedoms that we have in Canada. This includes over 12,000 Indigenous soldiers who fought for Canada in its wars. 2,700 Indigenous Peoples continue to serve today. I hope you will take some time next week to recognize the contributions of Indigenous soldiers.

Here at PMPS, we have the responsibility to honour and respect the four directions: land, water, plants, animals, and ancestors. Today, this area is home to many Indigenous Peoples from across Turtle Island. We acknowledge the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation of the Anishinaabek (awe-nish-naw'-beck) Peoples on whose ancestral and treaty lands we teach, learn and live. I also acknowledge that these lands are covered by treaties 18 & 19.
