**Monitor progress regularly**: -Ongoing assessment and evaluation -Examine our teaching practices and use best practices in our teaching practice -Use board provided resources such as BrightSpace to learn more about reading instruction and Critical Thinking Classrooms to learn more about math instruction.

**Intervene immediately**: -Regular assessment and evaluation, examine the data collected and use it to inform our practice, small group instruction to target gaps, Regular ISTs & discussion about appropriate interventions, ongoing communication with families.
