Empowerment Day: May 4th

It is an annual event that brings together 5000 students from across the school board, to gather at the Sleeman Centre, Guelph, ON, to hear from powerful guest speakers. Our students in grades 7 and 8 will be attending Empowerment Day and have an opportunity to hear from a variety of speakers including Orlando Bowen, Spencer West, Choir, Choir, Choir and Clara Hughes.

Orlando Bowen is a motivational speaker who inspires teamwork and advocates for anti-black racism. Spencer West is an activist for ableism as well as lgbtq+ rights. He will help us consider how digital spaces can be used for positive change and what we can do to support others. Choir! Choir! Choir! are two musicians that have inspired many into crowd sing-a-longs. Both have promoted the idea of inclusivity while having fun participating in activities that may push us out of our comfort zone. Clara Hughes is a mental health activist who shares her inspirational story and journey as well as her addiction to winning and the impact it has had on her.

We have a virtual Mental health workshop provided by YouthSpeak scheduled for Friday, May 5th from 1:40-2:40 for Grades 6-8. The topic is Online Overdrive. Thanks to Ms. Soper for organizing this event and for applying and receiving a grant toward this presentation.

This one-hour assembly will provide students with a deeper look into the impact that online use may have on their mental health and overall well-being. Youth Speakers sharing their personal stories of how online use affected their self-esteem, choices, social groups, and self-concept. Students will leave with a greater understanding of the choices they are making online and how to interact and use technology in a healthier way.

This club is made up of a small group of Intermediates that has been meeting once per week since the fall to prepare for the contest. This year, the contest runs on Wednesday, May 17 and we have about 20 students participating, with some non-club members as well. The students writing the test will write it at school on that day. The test will be supervised by Mrs. Betts and they will have one hour to complete 25 multiple choice questions. Thanks to Mrs. Betts for offering this opportunity.

Congratulations to our Choir and Band - both won GOLD at Kiwanis. The Band has also qualified for Music Kiwanis Provincial Competition, this coming June. The band will submit a virtual recording and compete in Provincials in June. The Band will be performing at Ross Music and Arts Night on May 18th at 7pm.
