



Summer School 2020 Programs

Gr. 7/8 Literacy & Numeracy Support Programs

Upper Grand DSB offers Grade 7 & 8 students requiring additional help with the Ontario Curriculum, particularly in the areas of Literacy and Numeracy, an opportunity to participate in an 8-day summer remediation program. The program is intended for students whose achievement of expectations in Grade 7 or 8 Language &/or Mathematics indicates that they are likely to experience difficulty next year. Special education supports will be available. Given current circumstances, this program will be delivered virtually.

Students who are achieving a Level 2 or below in Language &/or Mathematics, and recommended by their Principal, are eligible to participate in the program. Parents of Grade 7 & 8 students can contact their home school to indicate their interest in the program and register. **Session Dates:** July 2nd - July 14th, 2020

Grade 8 Reach-Ahead Credits

June 30th - July 24th, 2020; 8:30 a.m. - 2:45 p.m. daily

****Students require reliable, daily access to the internet and a computer/laptop.****

Reach ahead credits allow graduating Grade 8 students to earn a high school credit prior to entering secondary school in September. Learners will get a head start on credit accumulation, develop learning & technology skills that will be useful in all secondary settings while gaining self-confidence through successful completion of a high school credit. Students can choose between two course options: **GLS 10** or **CHV 20/GLC 20**. Given current circumstances, these courses will be delivered virtually. Special education supports will be available.

GLS 10—Learning Strategies: Skills for Success in Secondary School (1 credit) **Elective high school credit.

This course focuses on learning strategies to help students become better, more independent learners. Students will learn how to develop & apply literacy and numeracy skills, personal management skills, and interpersonal & teamwork skills to improve their learning and achievement in school, the workplace, and the community. The course helps students build confidence and motivation to pursue opportunities for success in secondary school and beyond.

CHV 20 - Civics (1/2 credit) **Compulsory credit for high school graduation.

This course explores rights & responsibilities associated with being an active citizen in a democratic society. Students will explore issues of civic importance such as healthy schools, community planning, environmental responsibility, & the influence of social media, while developing their understanding of the role of civic engagement & of political processes in the local, national, &/or global community.

GLC 20 - Careers (1/2 credit) **Compulsory credit for high school graduation.

This course teaches students how to develop & achieve personal goals for future learning, work & community involvement. Students will assess their interests, skills & characteristics and investigate current economic & workplace trends, work opportunities, & ways to search for work. The course explores post-secondary learning & career options, prepares students for managing work & life transitions, and helps students focus on their goals through the development of a career plan & post-secondary budget.

Summer school offers a selection of new credits from Grade 9 to 12. Daily attendance is mandatory. Given current circumstances, these courses will be delivered virtually. **Learners will require reliable, daily access to the internet and a computer or laptop.**

Students cannot be registered in more than one summer school program in the same session (i.e. students cannot register for an elearning summer course and a “regular” summer school course). For students with IEPs, special education supports will be available.

Secondary Upgrading Credits

Upgrading courses are for students who have already passed a course (min. mark 50%) in this school year but wish to improve their final grade. Upgrading courses will contain similar content to the course completed at a student’s home school. The upgrading version of a credit is condensed (students have fewer &/or shorter assessments) and is completed in a 55 hour (9 day) format & will be delivered virtually. Please see the chart above for courses which students can opt to upgrade.
