## Dear parents/guardians, students and staff:

WDG Public Health continues to provide opportunities for residents to receive their COVID-19 vaccination. Public Health will be hosting a COVID-19 Pfizer vaccine clinic at your school for eligible students and staff.

## Who may attend this clinic?

- Students and staff age 12 and older, and students who are turning 12 in 2021 (born in 2009) are eligible to attend the clinic to receive the COVID-19 Pfizer vaccine.
- Individuals may attend for their first or second dose of the Pfizer vaccine.

### **Second doses**

- The COVID-19 Pfizer vaccine requires two doses.
- WDGPH will be back to the school to offer a second clinic for those requiring their second doses in October.

# What do I need to know or bring with me?

- In order to help WDG Public Health facilitate the clinic and ensure all interested students and staff have an opportunity to attend, your school may have a sign-up process to help manage gathering limits for the clinic. Check with your school for further details.
- Students and staff may also drop-in during the "drop-in" time advertised.
- There is no minimum age for consent for medical treatment. The immunizing nurse will have a
  conversation with each student to determine their mental capacity to provide their own informed consent to
  receive the vaccine on that day. Parental consent is only required if youth is unable to provide informed
  consent themselves.
- Students and staff are encouraged to bring their OHIP (health card) to the appointment, if possible. Individuals without a health card are still able to be vaccinated and can bring another form of ID (i.e. passport, driver's license, birth certificate).
