





WELCOME BACK ASSEMBLY PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS WELLINGTON HEIGHTS SECONDARY SCHOOL September 12, 2023

Good morning, Wellington Heights students and staff, and welcome to the 2023-2024 school year! My name is Mr. Bloch, and my pronouns are he and him. I am delighted and honoured to serve for the fourth year as the Principal at WHSS, and I am confident that this year will truly be an amazing and exciting high school experience with all extracurricular events, sports teams, and special events in full swing. It will also be a special year in our school's history as this year we mark the 20th anniversary of our school, which was built in 2004 and brought together students from the former Arthur District High School and Mount Forest District High School and turned them all into Wellington Heights Wolverines.

Last week in homerooms, your teachers reviewed with you our expectations of you, as outlined in the WHSS Student Handbook. I have also emailed all students with a link to the WHSS Student Handbook, and hard copies can be picked up, for those who require one, just outside the main office. You will notice that there are some clear policies about identity-based harm, electronic devices, washroom breaks, academic integrity, and attendance - among others. Please take the time to read through this document in order to learn more about Wellington Heights and the high expectations that we have of our Wolverine students. We have a gender-neutral washroom available to all students in our Main Office, and we have a new Gender Affirmation process, through the Main Office, for all students who change their usual names, legal names, and pronouns. We also have a Multi-Faith Prayer Room in the Main Office that is available to all students for meditation.

During your high school career, it may be difficult to maintain one's self discipline and to aim for higher than mediocrity at times. In the words of former Arthur District High School Principal, P.E. Brown, "Do not forget that

our years spent in formal education are a preparation for our future responsibilities in the world of work. In the course of this preparation, we can do nothing else other than insist on our best possible effort in everything we undertake." Whether that be in the completion of our studies or our participation in extracurricular activities, we must develop the habit of giving nothing but our best effort. "In this manner, by giving our closest attention to seemingly minor details and by striving for perfection in what appear to be small matters, we are making the best possible preparation for our vocation in life."
